PART 6 - PARENT INFORMATION

- I. **FINANCES** – Please read carefully and note that we are a *ministry* to families and churches. As a *ministry* we are required to be good stewards of that ministry. We carefully evaluate each family that applies to verify the need and the fit of their goals with our ministry mission. While funding is to our long-term existence, we want each family to understand that we are only asking for what is possible. Some families will be able to pay the full amount. Other families will only be able to pay a fraction of the full tuition amount. We have set up a scholarship program and creative financing options. When we see a boy that is ready for what we offer, a dad and mom ready to participate in our program, and a church ready to disciple, we are ready to help.

While arranging the finances for such an endeavor probably seems daunting, remember that the soul of your son is very valuable. The rescue of your son is a very worthy endeavor. We would all agree that it is more valuable than a new car, or a vacation. If the son's heart continues on its current path, what would a college fund accomplish? Our challenge to you is to consider the value. **Please pursue what your son needs.** Take the time to work through the finance options and see what kind of help is available. Many times the funds come from three or four different sources, but miraculously, the funds come.

- A. There is a \$50 application fee, to be sent in with the completed application.
- B. Tuition (including Housing, Food, Individual and Group Counseling, School Uniform Shirts, and Activities Fees): The full cost of tuition is \$2,500 per month. Depending on family income, with scholarships and additional source funding many parents pay less. The decisions about tuition and financial assistance are dependent upon several things: the amount that the family can afford, the amount of scholarship funds available, and the fit of the boy, family, and church to the program. The Board of Directors is entrusted with the final decisions concerning financial matters. Tuition can be paid monthly. Financing plans are available. Please visit our website, VAFB.org, and look under the application page for information on scholarships and other sources of funding to help with the costs.
- C. There is a one-time technology fee of \$400 due at intake.
- D. Remedial, advanced courses, and/or tutoring may have additional charges.
- E. Parenting Course (required for each parent) is included in tuition price. Books are additional.
- F. Mission trip costs vary depending on the location and travel expenses for the trip. The boys may raise money through work projects in the community to fund the mission trip. Parents cover the amount not raised by the boys. Normal costs to the parents are between \$400 and \$700. This fee is charged when final trip details are complete.
- G. Spending money is **not** required, and is limited to a maximum of \$20 per month. This is used by the boy to cover toiletry items and snacks. We go Christmas shopping after Thanksgiving so extra money can be given for that time. Extra may be sent for Mission Trip spending money as well. When there are extra trips, tuition costs cover any miscellaneous expenses.

While finances are almost always difficult to work out, this is a ministry that desires to help every family that is ready to do the work of change. Tuition Assistance is available as scholarship funds become available. Please contact the director for an application. Financing plans are available.

II. **MEDICAL**

- A. A complete physical examination must be performed prior to arrival, and pertinent medical records should be sent to Victory Academy. Each boy must be free of all contagious diseases, including venereal diseases. All mental and physical impairments and or handicaps must be fully disclosed at time of application. All psychiatric and or psychological diagnoses and evaluations that pertain to the boy or parents must be disclosed at time of application. A complete history of sexual issues must be documented in our files.
- B. We are required by the State of Wisconsin to keep a copy of each student's immunization records. An information sheet is provided by the State and is available upon request. If there are no records, then a statement from the parents stating that is required.
- C. **Health/Accident insurance is required** and policy information must be on file with us at time of admission.
- D. A completed Medical Release Form (page of application) is required.

III. ITEMS TO BRING

PLEASE PUT INITIALS ON EVERY ITEM WITH PERMANENT MARKER.

A. Basic needs:

(Most of the needs can be taken care of with what the boy already has/ is using now.) Each boy should have the following: **Clothing:** 6 pairs of underwear, 6 pairs of socks, 6 pairs of athletic socks, 6 tee shirts, 1 bathrobe (optional), 5 pair of work pants or blue jeans, 1 pair of insulated work shoes, 1 pair of insulated work gloves, work shirts or sweat shirts, 1 work coat, 1 pair of tennis shoes, 1 pair of dress shoes, 1 pair of house shoes or slippers, swimming trunks, snow boots. **Bedding:** Please bring one twin size blanket and one comforter or bedspread, one set twin size sheets, pillow and pillowcase, padded mattress cover, 2 bath towels and washcloths, and a sleeping bag. **General:** Bible (Several translations are welcome, but for continuity in teaching and memory work, please also bring an ESV-English Standard Version), basic school supplies, bookbag or backpack for school, canteen or water bottle, toiletries. **Items not allowed will be discarded or sent home, at the staff's discretion.**

B. Uniform dress for school:

4 pairs of navy blue casual khaki pants (Dockers style, does not need to be Dockers brand, **no denim**), The first set of red polo shirts are provided by Victory, replacement shirts are purchased with the boys' personal money, at least one matching sweater (not a sweatshirt), 1 pair of black or brown dress shoes, plain black or brown belt. As you son progresses to upper level, he will need other collared shirts as the red uniform shirt isn't required.

C. Church dress:

Church clothes are needed for Sunday and Wednesday. While not required every Sunday, the boys need a suit or a sport coat, dress shirt and matching tie, and dress pants for Sunday services. For Wednesday night the boys who participate in the teen program may wear jeans and a t-shirt or collared shirt (those attending the adult service wear collared shirts and nice jeans or khakis). Please make a differentiation between school clothes and church clothes. Please provide a pair of brown or black dress shoes designated for church.

D. Other Optional Items:

Ice hockey skates and equipment, soccer shoes, camping equipment, snow pants or snowsuit, paintball equipment, a mountain bike (with helmet), and baseball glove will be used if brought but are not required. No skateboards or snowboards. Pictures of family and animals are nice for the boys to have. No other photos are allowed. Each boy should have a wallet of some type to keep money in so it can be kept together when turned in to the staff.

*We do not permit our students to wear clothing that could detract from the Christian character that we will be encouraging. Necklaces and piercing jewelry aren't allowed. Any writings or sayings on clothing must not be negative in their impact on the attitudes and life of a Christian and are subject to staff discretion. Shirts must be worn at all times. Any clothing, jewelry, etc, that is not in compliance with the rules will be sent home. Haircut must be neat, short, conservative and approved by staff.

IV. VISITING AND CORRESPONDENCE

Corresponding with anyone other than family or pastor must be pre-approved by the program director. **All incoming and outgoing mail is subject to scanning by a staff member.** We request that *each parent write at least one letter or card per week*. Letters are important to the success of each boy. However, any letter containing profanity or continued negative information will not be forwarded. Please be sure your son has a supply of stamps and envelopes.

Phone calls to the boy will not be permitted for the first month that the boy is here. (The staff may be called *at any time* regarding the boy). After the first month, the parents are encouraged to call once a week. It is best to pick out a night when you are going to call so your son will know to be waiting for you at that time. Please keep the conversation positive and limit it to 20 minutes, because we have many people using the phone. **Phone calls may be monitored by a staff member. Any time a call is monitored, all parties will be notified.** Each parent please initial _____

Visits from parents may be arranged through the staff after the boy has been here two months. During first semester visits, the boy may be allowed to go to town with his parents, but is not allowed to spend the night away from VA (limited housing is available on campus). Second semester he may earn the privilege to spend the nights off with his parents. Services are conducted at the Faith Baptist Church on Sundays and Wednesdays. If possible, visits should be scheduled on one of these days so that the family may attend church services together. Parents are encouraged to visit once a month. If this is not possible, parents are required to visit at least one time the first semester and when possible, two times the second semester.

Thanksgiving Day is a big day at the Academy. We ask the families of the boys to come up for the Thursday for Thanksgiving dinner and Friday for the Parent seminar. Families are also welcome to hang around through Sunday as well. Christmas break is a two or three week vacation from school when the boys go home. During second semester, a boy may earn the privilege to spend a long weekend *with his parents*. During the last few months, once reaching level 5, home visits are encouraged in an effort to prepare the boy and parents for his permanent return to home.

V. MISSION TRIP

Each boy is given the opportunity to participate in a mission trip. These trips are designed to help the boys see a larger world where God is at work. Many of the lessons of the year are exemplified during the trip. They also get to see that though most of the world isn't as wealthy as America, the people with less stuff are often more joyful. This trip is vital to our program and each boy is required to go. Because of the purpose and nature of the trip there are times when a boy doesn't earn the privilege of participating in the trip. When a boy doesn't make the trip, extra school and work projects are assigned for his time on campus at Victory. **Please contact us to discuss applying for a passport before arrival at Victory as it is required for all travel outside the United States.**

VI. PARENT REQUIREMENTS

A. Church attendance:

In an effort to strengthen families, we *require* that both parents, **on a weekly basis** attend a church that preaches and teaches a simple, biblical Gospel and holds the Holy Bible as the authority for life and godliness. If the church is other than Baptist or Bible in background, please contact Mark Massey, director, regarding your church’s fit with our program.

B. Homework:

Each quarter we have a homework assignment for each parent. These may include books, audio tapes, and worksheets. **Each** parent is required to complete the homework. Each section of material is geared to help strengthen your marriage and you as a parent. It can also help make your home a more peaceful place. **The level of the success of our program is dependent upon the level of parental involvement.**

C. Scripture Reading and Memory Work:

Daily Scripture reading and memory work assignments are required for each parent.

D. Accountability Sheets:

Accountability sheets are required to be filled out and turned in on schedule every other week.

E. Parent Orientation:

Upon arrival for admission of your son, we have an orientation schedule that includes personal counsel and a 2-hour orientation session for the parents.

E. Parent Counsel:

Parents are required to spend a three-day period at the campus to facilitate spiritual and relational growth for their family.

F. Parent Conferences:

Each year three conferences are held on our campus to help parents solve problems, restore relationships, and set up a family life plan for their sons’ return to their homes. Each parent must attend at least two of these Friday-Saturday conferences while their son is in the program. If your son is here over Thanksgiving, that Parent Conference is required. Please begin scheduling these at intake.

G. Home Visit:

When possible and helpful, a husband/wife staff family visits in your home for two-three days to encourage and help strengthen both parents, and other siblings in preparation for the student’s return home.

H. Father/son Advances:

Each year we schedule times for the fathers and sons to get together. It includes special programs with outdoor activities, devotions, and seminar material to get the dads working and communicating with their sons as they rebuild and strengthen their relationships. You are invited to all, but attendance to one of these Advances is required.

PART 7 - RULES

Victory Academy for Boys General Rules

Our program is decidedly Christian. All aspects of our program are centered around the teachings in the Bible. We consider the Bible authoritative in dealing with interpersonal relationships, problems and circumstances of life. The Christian virtues of character are the goals we are working toward. Those virtues include: honesty, obedience, kindness, and diligence.

We realize the adjustment to this setting could be difficult. We are expecting to help each of the students learn the rules and procedures that will become part of his daily life while at Victory. We endeavor to be kind, consistent, and caring. All problem solving will be handled within the framework of the Bible (Ephesians 4:25-32).

General Principles:

- 1. **Mutual respect** is expected at all times.
- 2. **Obedience** toward the staff is required.
- 3. **Kindness** is expected. Part of kindness is edifying (building) communication.
- 4. **Biblical problem solving** is to be recognized as the goal in every conflict.
- 5. **House rules** are to be followed.
- 6. **Diligent work ethic** is to be developed.
- 7. **Participation** in all activities and work assignments is required.

General House Rules:

- 1. A shower, combed hair, a shave (if necessary), brushed teeth (twice daily – once morning, once evening), clean clothes, and deodorant are required daily.
- 2. All clothes will be subject to staff assessment. Tank tops are allowable for work and P.E. Acceptable attire does not include ragged or baggy style clothing.
- 3. Each boy’s personal area should be kept in order at all times.
- 4. All purchases and exchanges must be approved by staff. All money will be kept, for safekeeping, by the Academy Staff and given as needed. Personal needs need to be written down and given to the house parents. Wallets may be obtained when a student is going to town or a place where he can shop.
- 5. Staff notification and approval is required before a boy may leave the Academy’s property. No hiking without permission.
- 6. Correspondence is outlined in the application. First month: only by mail, limited to close relatives with few exceptions. Second month: Phone calls weekly for 20 minute limit, parents only with few exceptions. After two months: visits are allowable, max. one per month, close relatives and approved adults.

It is our mission to work with families that are at a crisis point in the relationships within their homes. We recognize that in every case, each member of the family has areas of his or her life that need growth and change. Following these guidelines provides an environment of peace in which the light of the Bible can reveal the needs and answers to the problems, circumstances, and relationship issues in our lives.

- **STEP 1: For initial consideration**
 - ⇒ Complete and send the application. A completed application should include:
 - A copy of any psychiatric evaluations, special IEP requirements, any records that would help us place the student according to his needs.
 - A recent photo of boy, and/or family (snapshot is fine).
 - The application fee of \$50.
 - The notarized pages can wait until Step 2.
 - ⇒ Make a photocopy of the application for your records so you can refer to parent information and other important material.
 - ⇒ Make sure your pastor and anyone listed on the application are aware that we will be calling to discuss the situation and that you are considering your son as a student.

- **STEP 2: Once we have received your application and given *Tentative Acceptance* into the program, please:**
 - ⇒ Send: Photocopy of Birth Certificate and Social Security card (not an original).
 - ⇒ Send: Copy of his Insurance card or information
